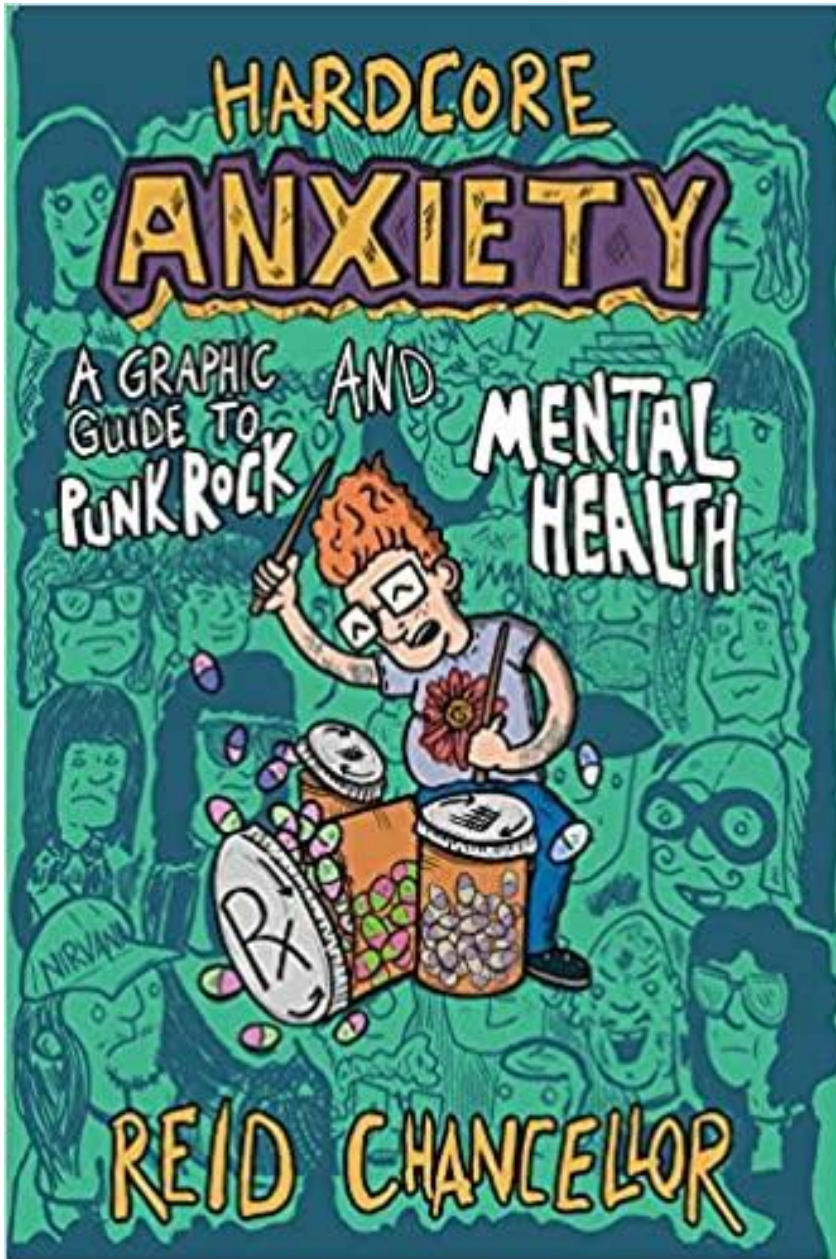
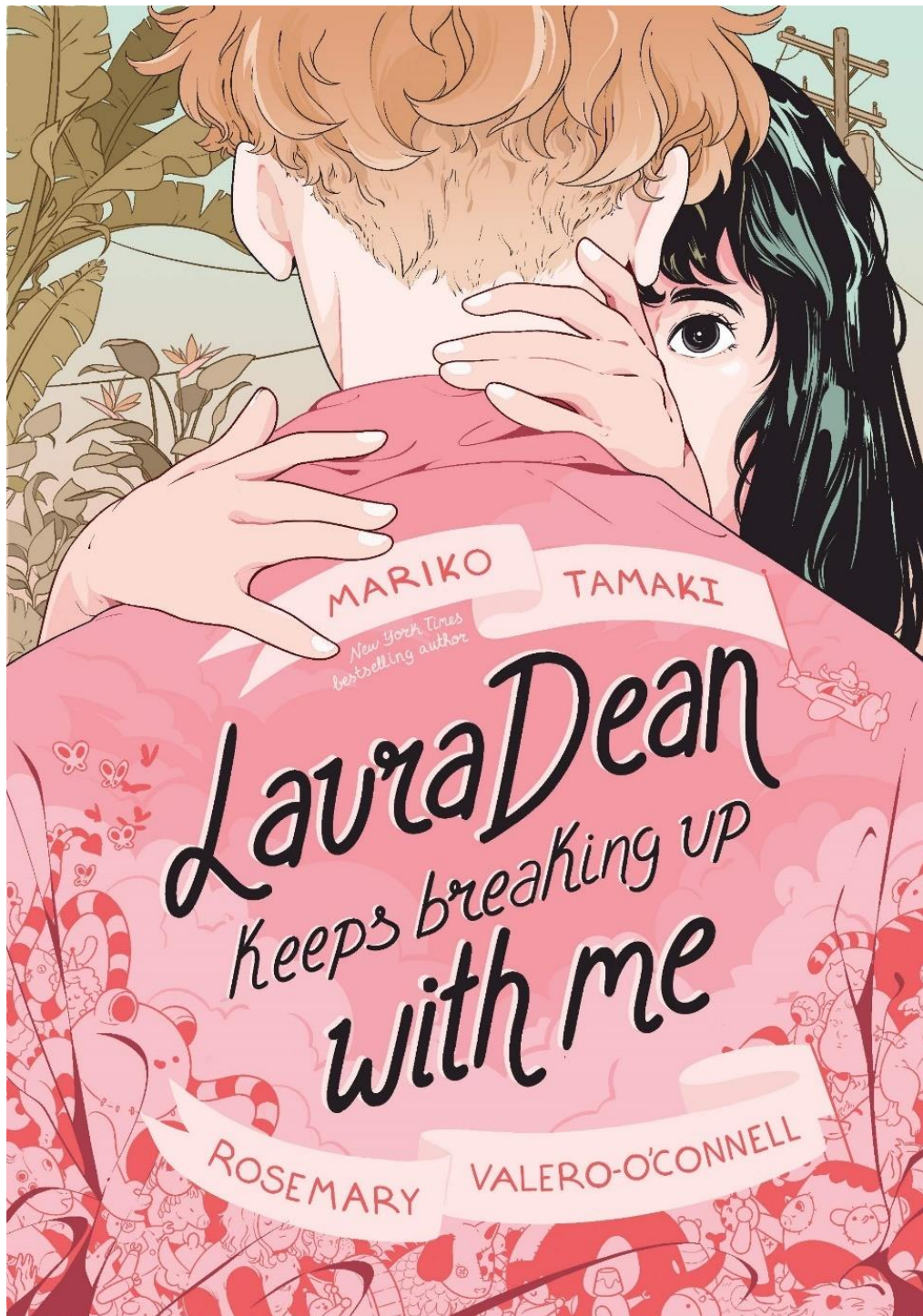

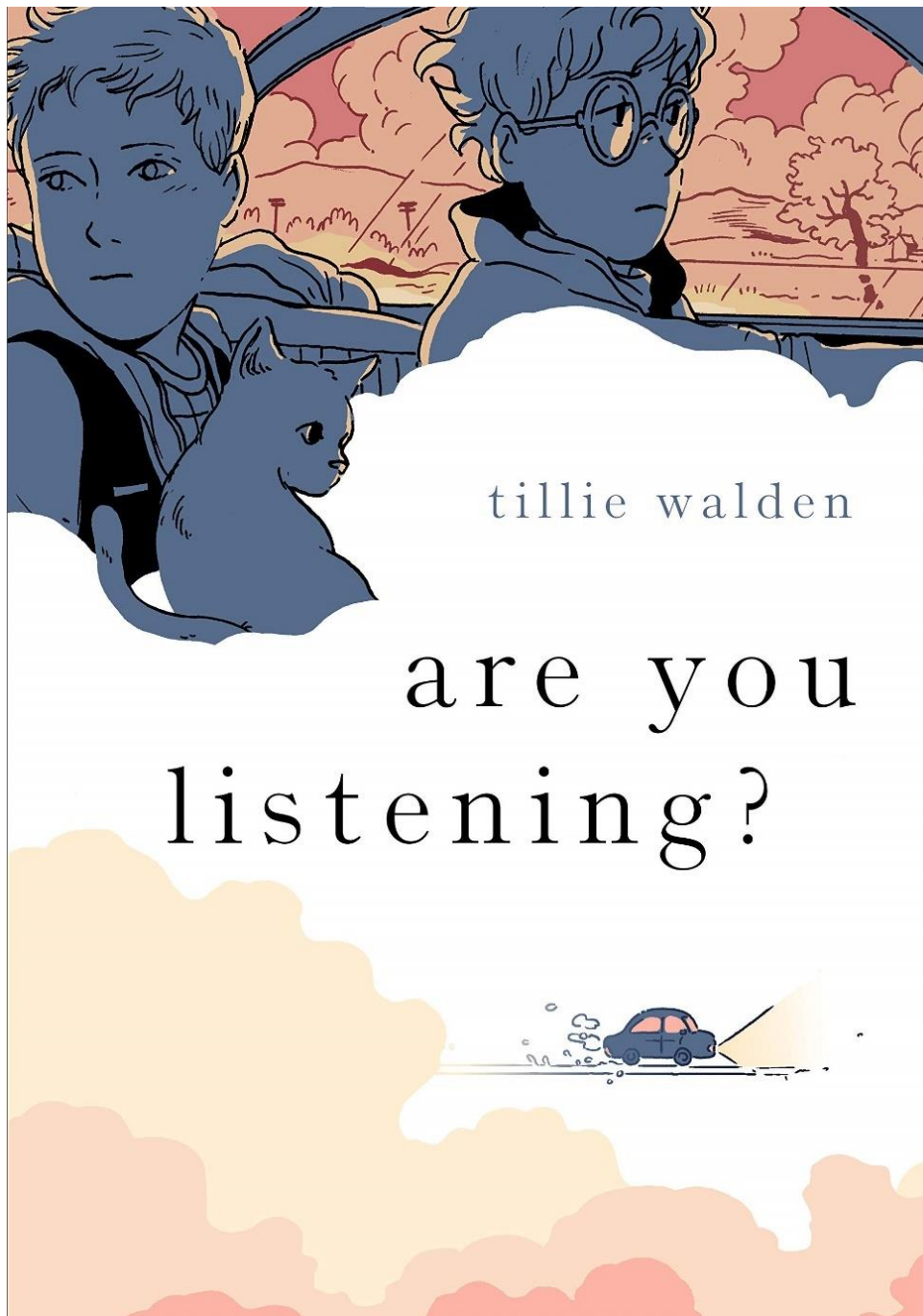
Hardcore Anxiety: A Graphic Guide to Punk Rock and Mental Health by Reid Chancellor
