Award amount: \$5,000 annually and is renewable up to 5 years contingent on full-time enrollment at the Fort Collins campus.

Purpose: encourages participation in higher education by first generation college students who have significant financial needs. CU Boulder defines a “first generation college student’ as someone whose parent(s)/guardians have not completed a bachelor’s degree.

Award Amount: \$4,000 per year, up to 10 semesters or 150 credit hours, whichever comes first.

Purpose: encourages participation in higher education by first generation college students who have significant financial needs. Colorado Mesa University defines a “first generation college student’ as someone whose parent(s)/ court ordered legal guardians have not completed a bachelor’s degree. Students must live in the US but do not have to be a valid permanent resident or citizen to receive the award.

Award Amount: \$1,000 per year; student must successfully complete a minimum of 12 credit hours each fall and spring semesters up to a maximum of 120 credits. Must maintain a GPA of 3.0 or higher
