





GPA is the average of all the final class grades you receive for classes taken while in high school. The GPA scale converts your letter grades into a single summary number. Your GPA is often used by colleges, employers, technical programs, and scholarships to quickly assess your skills, work ethic, and willingness to challenge yourself. **PSD calculates GPAs on a 4.0 scale**.



Graduation Credit for Middle School Classes

CREDITS & GRADES earned for approved courses **AUTOMATICALLY** calculated into a student's high school GPA! They will appear in your grade history for review. Students and Parents may choose to <u>NOT</u> receive high school credits for qualifying middle school courses. The only way to negate this impact is to OPT-OUT and decline the high school credit.

As stated in PSD Policy IKF-3, the window for declining HS credit begins the FIRST day of the student's ninth grade school year and ends the LAST day of a student's ninth grade school year. You do this using the PSD High School Credit for Middle School Courses Opt-Out Form. The form is on the PSD website or from the FCHS Registrar, Ms. Julie Stajduhar.


English Language Arts Course Descriptions

Grade 10 Language Arts

5412 | World Literature/Composition (English 10): 10 credits — grade 10 —English Language Arts — prerequisite: 9th grade English

This course provides students with a foundation in reading and writing skills necessary for completion of a comprehensive standards- based high school curriculum. The course integrates the teaching of writing with the study of literature. Students read a substantial selection of world literature including short stories, novels, drama (including Shakespeare), non-fiction, and poetry. Writing instruction is based on the Six-Traits Model. Students produce expository, narrative, descriptive, persuasive, technical, and creative writings. At FCHS: This is a prerequisite for US Literature and Composition (11th grade English).
