Hello PSD Seniors! Welcome to the PSD Scholarship Application. Before you begin, please download, print and take time to review the <u>LIST OF SCHOLARSHIPS</u>. This list includes the scholarship name, criteria, any additional application materials that may be required, the scholarship amount and a brief description of the scholarship. Please note that this list is the only place you will see the scholarship descriptions within the application. You will want to refer to this list as you fill out the application. Again, it is highly suggested that you download this list for your reference as you work through the application. Pay close attention to the scholarship description as you *must* meet the criteria specified in order to be eligible for each scholarship to which you wish to apply.

PSD SCHOLARSHIP APPLICATION SECTIONS

In the section following this overview, section 3, you will answer several questions that will provide donors with your applicant information. You must answer the required questions to move to the next section. Required questions contain an asterisk (*). In sections 4-5, you will write your required essay and optionally provide an unusual circumstances statement. It is highly recommended that you copy and paste your essay from a Word or Google Doc. In sections 6-7, you will be upload materials for the PSD Scholarship Application. Make sure to name the files correctly! In section 8, you will select the scholarships to which you are applying. In section 9, you will be uploading extra materials as specified by individual scholarships. You will officially submit your application in Section 10. You must press submit before the deadline. The deadline is Friday, January 24, 2025 at 4:30pm. **This deadline is strict and late applications will not be accepted.**

Section 6: OBTAIN AND UPLOAD ONE LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION

You are required to submit one letter of recommendation. There are 2 ways to submit your letter of recommendation:

- 1. After you have received your letter of recommendation from your recommender, upload your letter of recommendation below. Your letter of rec file must be a pdf saved as your Last name First Name LOR Recommender Name. (For example Doe Jane LOR John Smith.)
- 2. If the letter of recommendation is confidential, please have your recommender email their letter of recommendation directly to mgrady@psdschools.org with the subject PSD Scholarship Letter of Recommendation. Please ask them to save their letter as Student Last name_Student First Name LOR Recommender Name.

Please allow your recommender(s) at least two weeks to write your letter. A letter of recommendation from out-of-school sources may be used.

After you have obtained a copy of your most recent unofficial transcript, upload a pdf of your transcript below. Your transcript file must be a pdf saved as your Last name_First name_Transcript. (For example Doe_Jane_Transcript.)
