Student Leadership Opportunity!

We are excited to share an amazing leadership opportunity that has the potential to positively impact the culture and climate of our school.

The initiative is a partnership between FCHS and CSU's Center for Public Deliberation to better understand and address student concerns about equitable access and outcomes.

Students are encouraged to apply to serve as "Student Equity Advocates." They will be trained in conducting a public deliberative discourse to gather information about the student experience from their fellow students. This information will be analyzed and shared with staff and students with the goal of impacting our students' well-being and sense belonging in our building.

Selected Student Equity Advocates will engage in a four-hour training hosted at FCHS by staff from the Center for Public Deliberation on October 8.

Boettcher Scholarship

The application deadline is November 1, 2021, no later than 5:00 PM.

Test-Optional:

Boettcher has moved to a test-optional application for the Class of 2022. Boettcher still encourages applicants to submit test scores, if possible, as that will be one more piece of data they will consider in the application review process.

Please get in touch with your counselor

ASAP if you decide to apply for the Boettcher Foundation Scholarship. S/he needs to provide a detailed recommendation for you.

The application process is a time-consuming one for both students and counselors – an early start is essential to your success!

How to Apply to College

While applying to college can seem overwhelming, it's really just paperwork. Take it one step at a time and know that it will all work out.

Your counselor is there to help with the big picture; **Eileen Hostetter** (FCHS College & Career Center Coordinator) will help with all the details: ehostett@psdschools.org

Order your official transcript early! That starts the process at Collins. You do not have to wait until you complete your application to have your records sent — the college will start a file for you and monitor it until it's complete.

To request that your transcript be sent, please fill out the [FCHS Transcript Request Form](#) and return it to Ms. Hostetter. List each of your colleges and mark whether you used the Common Application, the Coalition Application, or the school's online application.

Official transcripts are \$3 apiece; please pay online through SchoolPay or the FCHS Bookkeeper. One \$3 fee will cover all your Common Application schools.

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Colorado Free Application Days! October 19-21, 2021

If you submit your application **between 12:01 AM on Tuesday, October 19 and 11:59 PM on Thursday, October 21**, you can apply for free at any public institution in Colorado (and many private Colorado institutions as well).

Plan to have your applications 100% completed ahead of time and then simply hit the SUBMIT button during that timespan.

Applications always take more time than you expect them to, and computer systems are apt to crash on deadline days. Exceptions are not made for technical problems or submission delays.

Common App How-Tos

The Common App is an undergraduate application clearinghouse that students may use to apply to almost 900 member colleges and universities. The Common App is time consuming to complete, but worth the effort if you are applying to multiple schools that accept it.

Your Common Application has two sides:

- Your personal section, which FCHS cannot access.
- An FCHS section, which provides information directly to Common App on your behalf (your transcript, counselor forms, etc.).

Official Transcript

Order your official transcript from Ms. Hostetter in the Career Center and indicate that you are using the Common Application. One \$3 fee will cover transcripts for all your Common App schools (but please list them all).



Ordering your official transcript starts the paperwork process at FCHS!

You can submit your transcript request to us at any time. You don't need to have completed your application – you only need to have started it.

Counselor Report and SSR

Common Applications require a *Counselor Report* and a *Secondary School Report*. You do not need to provide those forms. Ms. Hostetter will prepare them for your counselor and then submit to the Common App when complete.

Optional Counselor Letter of Rec

The Common Application does not require counselor letters of recommendation. If you wish to include one, please ask your counselor in person about writing it for you. Complete an [Academic Profile Sheet](#) and give it to your counselor with a copy of your resume. Please allow him/her at least two weeks to craft a letter for you. Your deadlines are your responsibility!

Teacher Evaluation Forms and Letters of Recommendation

On your Common Application, under each individual college that you add to your list, you'll need to provide the names and email addresses of teachers (or others) who will be providing letters of recommendation for you. Common App will then contact those people directly, providing them with a secure link and instructions for upload.

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Common App, continued:

Supplemental Forms

Many Common App schools require supplemental forms. Some member institutions require that you submit the supplement prior to submitting the Common App. Find information about those requirements on the dashboard of your Common Application account, under "My Colleges." Click on each college to review their additional requirements.

To Link your Counselor to the Common Application:

- 1) Add your counselor the general part of your Common App account, inviting him/her to recommend you.
- 2) Assign your counselor to at least one school in your application list.

Go to the MY COLLEGES tab

Click on one institution

Go to the RECOMMENDERS & FERPA section

Click the "Assign" button or "Add Another" link

Select the name of your counselor

Once that is done, your name will appear on your counselor's Common App account, and we'll be able to submit your transcript and the school report form.
