Type into the search bar what it is you are looking for and press Enter.

If we have what you are looking for note whether it is available. In this example for a Title Search the library owns 3 copies of "The Hunger Games" but only 1 is available.

The next example shows you how to do an Author Search. Type into the search bar the name of the author. You can do this 2 ways, first and last name or last name, first name. You do not have to capitalize the name. If you want to find the latest books by that author sort by Date Published. Note that this search will also list foreign language versions of a title by that author that we have in our library.

The next example shows you how to do a Subject Search. Use this search strategy if your subject is very general. I typed in the subject "hurricanes" and sorted the list by subject. Note that the search includes both fiction and non-fiction titles.

Summary Note: In the wake of Hurricane Katrina, longtime New Orleans residents Abdulrahman and Kathy Zeitoun are cast into an unthinkable struggle with forces beyond wind and water. In the days after the storm, Abdulrahman traveled the flooded streets in a secondhand canoe, passing on supplies and helping those he could. A week later, on September 6, 2005, Zeitoun abruptly disappeared-- arrested and accused of being an agent of al Qaeda.

The last example shows how to do a Keyword Search. This is like a subject search but is best used if your subject is specific or you are looking for a book that references a topic and you don't have a specific author or title in mind. You can also use it if you know only a keyword in the title, but not the whole title, of a book. Type in a keyword and press Enter. In this example I typed in "racism". Note the number of titles that appear on the list. Sort the list by date published to find the most current books that have the keyword "racism" in the title or in the cataloged description of the book.
